Tasks

- Researches and obtains images, reproduction rights, formats and edits captions according to the *C Magazine* House Style Guide
- Administers contributor contracts
- Collects mailing addresses for complimentary copies
- Manages deadlines, communications, and follow-ups for all of the above, as necessary
- Prepares PDFs of individual contributions and distributes them to the authors
- Transcribes audio files
- Reads feature texts to produce abstracts and assign keywords for the archive
- Assists in developing press releases and online resources, such as newsletters, and article texts and images on cmagazine.com
- Helps coordinate public programming
- Assists with other administrative and research tasks as necessary
- Assists with training an incoming editorial intern

This position is geared towards someone who has undertaken university studies in visual art, critical and curatorial studies, arts management, art history, or related field(s); and/or, someone who has editorial experience in arts and culture. A demonstrable interest in contemporary art is required. Candidates must possess excellent research skills, advanced writing and communication skills, and a working knowledge of Mac OS X, MS Word and Excel, and Google Apps and Drive. Candidates must be able to work independently, with the supervision of the Editor, at a location of their choice, using their own computer.
